We recognize our responsibility to maintain order, while affording dignity and respect to every individual.



#### **INTERNAL AFFAIRS**

Major functions of the Internal Affairs Division include interviews, interrogations, report writing, and investigating violations of department policies, rules and orders. Also included are health and welfare bulletins for employees within the police department, handling any complaints by citizens, and random drug testing of personnel. The IA Pro system is used to log and maintain all control of persons (use of force by officers), vehicle pursuits, personnel, vehicle accidents, and administrative inquiries and internal affairs investigations. The Internal Affairs Division reports directly to the Chief of Police.

## PLANTATION POLICE


The Plantation Police Department has been accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) since 1998 and by the CALEA Public Safety Communications Accreditation Program since 2012. The department has also been accredited by the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) since 2000. Both are voluntary law enforcement accreditation programs. Every four years a team comprised of law enforcement professionals conducts an on-site assessment of our department to determine eligibility for re-accreditation.
