



# Command Officers Development Course

Sergeant John Diaz and Sergeant Kyle Mastrianni completed the Command Officers

Development Course (CODC) offered by the Southern Police Institute of the University of
Louisville.

The CODC is SPI's 400-hour flagship educational program for law enforcement mid to upper-level managers which provides a solid foundation for practical law enforcement administration and a comprehensive overview of management practices. This training is offered in five (5) two-week sessions over a period of five months. The challenging course complements SPI's Administrative Officers Course (AOC), and is traditionally held off campus at host agency sites.

The CODC has continuously evolved with changing social, economic, and political environments associated with local, state and federal units of government. Students fully participate in the course which is interactively facilitated by a large cadre of instructional staff. Students prepare and present staff studies and receive feedback from instructors and peers.



### Woman's Club Bicycle Giveaway

The Plantation Police Department and Plantation Woman's Club delivered 10 bicycles and helmets to children at Peters Elementary who had to earn 1500 points through the 2nd and 3rd quarters of the school year. The points were awarded based off grades, report cards, daily in-school studies, and good behavior.


### Internal Affairs

The Plantation Police Department Internal Affairs reports directly to the Chief of Police and is tasked with conducting interviews, interrogations, report writing, and investigating violations of department policies and procedures, rules, and orders. Internal Affairs handles health and wellfare bulletins for employees, handles complaints by citizens, and oversees the random drug testing of personnel. IA Pro software is used to log and maintain all control of persons (use of force by officers), vehicle pursuits, vehicle accidents, administrative inquires, and internal affairs investigations.
