We are committed and dedicated to reducing crime and enhancing relationships within our community so that the City of Plantation continues to prosper as a resilient and vibrant community.

MAYOR NICK SORTAL

Nick Sortal was elected Plantation Mayor on November 8, 2022. He had been elected to Plantation City Council in 2018 and 2020. Nick has lived in Plantation since 1993, when he married his wife, Robyn, whom he met while both were working at the Sun-Sentinel newspaper. Robyn and Nick are especially proud of their three children, Diane, Michelle and Aaron and they are blessed with three grandchildren, who all live in Davie. Mia is 4 and Aria and Aiden are one. Nick took a voluntary buyout from the Sun-Sentinel in November 2015 and signed a freelance contract with The Miami Herald in December 2015 that concluded when he filed to run for office. He also spent the past 30 years on school campuses as a basketball coach, at Cardinal Gibbons High, St. Thomas Aquinas and American Heritage School.

He merged his journalism and basketball passions in 2001 to write the book Basketball Tip-Ins: 100 Drills and Tips for Young Players, published by McGraw-Hill. Meanwhile, he continues his hobby of triathlon racing, competing in 8 to 10 races each year. His daily routine of swimming, biking, running and yoga has kept him in excellent shape, to the point that he has completed eight 70.3 (half-ironman) triathlons, which consist of a 1.2-mile swim, 56-mile bike ride and 13.1-mile run. Nick grew up in Herrin, IL, where his father was the basketball coach and junior high assistant principal. A gym is named in Mike Sortal's honor. Nick graduated from Southern Illinois University with degrees in mathematics and journalism and worked in Carbondale, IL, Owensboro, KY, St. Louis and Indianapolis before moving to Florida and fulfilling his 30-year career at the Sun-Sentinel. Nick says he is grateful for the encouragement he has received and will always remember that the Plantation residents pay his salary. Nick looks forward to interacting with residents as much as he can, such as at our monthly concerts, HOA meetings and houses of worship.





ACCREDITATION

During 2022 the Plantation Police Department successfully completed two reviews and two full reaccreditation assessments with the **Commission for Florida Law** Enforcement (CFA); and the **Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). The** PPD has a long-standing tradition of accreditation and recently achieved their ninth reaccreditation, and their third Excelsior Status Award, with the CFA. The CFA is a voluntary process that law enforcement agencies are encouraged to participate in. The program ensures on-going compliance and best practice, on a state level. To achieve Excelsior status the agency must have been continuously accredited without conditions, for five consecutive reaccreditations. CFA reaccreditation is conducted once every three years, the PPD is among only a handful of Florida law enforcement agencies that hold longstanding Excelsior status.

Plantation Police Department also maintains accreditations with CALEA, for both Communications and Law Enforcement, with a combined total of 23 years consecutive law enforcement accreditation. The compliance with necessary standards and qualifications are a staple of the PPD. Accreditation provides on-going oversite of the following areas: review of applicable department policies, review of training records and compliance, property and evidence compliance, and organizational and community engagement. The state of Florida has over 300 municipal, county, and state law enforcement agencies. There are over 200 accredited agencies through the CFA, of which eighty (80) currently hold Excelsior status. CALEA has a combined 1280 national and international enrolled agencies across the United States and throughout the world.

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION UPDATES


Digital Forensics Room

The Digital Forensics Room was designed to conduct video and evidentiary extraction, while also serving as a property and evidence component for mobile devices requiring extraction.

Due to the sensitive nature of the investigations that are conducted, this room is under restricted access.

CID Soft Room

At the request of Detective Graber and Mrs. Debbie Geller, a Soft Room was created, so that victims of specific crimes can wait or be interviewed in privacy versus sitting on a couch in view of every person in CID. The Soft Room is an environment for victims of DV, sexual battery, etc., that is more private and personal.

ROAD PATROL CRIME-PREVENTING OPERATIONS



Operation Orange Fun

Operation Orange Fun ensured the 800 plus visitors and participants enjoyed a week of tennis without any concerns for their safety in the city during the Annual Orange Bowl International Tennis Championship.

Operation Safe Streets

Operation Safe Streets proactively addressed crime trends that occur during the holiday season. This operation started on November 1st and ended on January 1st. Operation Safe Streets resulted in 55 arrests and 37 tickets.



ROAD PATROL VEST ADDITIONS

Ballistic Rifle Plates

Ballistic rifle plates were outfitted for officers' vests for extra protection.

Trauma Medical Kits

Officers were given a trauma medical kit that attaches to their vest. The trauma medical kit includes a tourniquet, a chest seal, combat gauze, NAR emergency trauma dressing (ETD) and a NAR Bear Claw glove kit.





SPECIAL OPERATIONS HIGHLIGHTS

LPR's (License Plate Readers)

In 2022, Special Operations went through a procurement process to select a vendor to install Automated License Plate Readers for the City. After a pilot study a vendor was selected, Rekor Recognition Systems.

Burglary Apprehension Team

In order to combat burglaries and auto thefts, the Street Crimes Unit joined the South Florida Task Force for burglary apprehension and vehicle crimes in April of 2022.

Southeast Police Motorcycle Rodeo

The Traffic Unit competes in the Southeast Police Motorcycle Rodeo annually that benefits the Concerns of Police Survivors (C.O.P.S.) organization.

Grants Received

In 2022 PPD partnered with the Florida Department of Transportation and the **Institute of Police Technology** and Management to secure traffic safety grants with the goal of reducing the number and severity of traffic crashes. These grants funded over 300 hours of additional dedicated traffic enforcement in the city. Furthermore, these grants funded the purchase of additional speed measurement devices and a portable digital message board, which is used to deliver traffic safety messages to motorists in areas identified as having a need.




GENERAL SERVICES DIVISON HIGHLIGHT



The Police Department purchased 13 Ford Hybrid vehicles in 2022 that are equipped with lights and safety features. Four of the vehicles are assigned to Sergeants and the Patrol Division will be utilizing them to respond to calls for service and emergency situations throughout the City of Plantation. The vehicles and equipment are replacing older vehicles greater than ten years old with high mileage and high maintenance costs.

TRAINING OUR PERSONNEL



Officers demonstrate proficiency in yearly firearm qualifications, active killer simulations and perform stop the bleed measures on victims. This real world scenario based training prepares our officers for potential threats.

FUNCTIONAL FITNESS

The Police Department's Functional Fitness program continues throughout the year with morning and afternoon classes offered twice a week. The workouts consist of vigorous trainings such as anaerobic, aerobic activity, plyometrics, calisthenics, running, cycling, strength weight lifting, high-intensity interval training, Pilates, circuit and endurance exercises. After participating in 20 classes, Human Resources provides participants with a \$25 gift card.





PLANTATION POLICE BASKETBALL TEAM



The Plantation Police basketball team known as the Plantation Police Ballers was formed in 2022 to enhance relationships with our schools, staff and students. The PPD Ballers had an undefeated record in 2022 and ended the year with official new uniforms!


