City Covid-19 Guidelines updated

On June 26, 2021, Governor Ron Desantis' Executive Order 21-94 extending the statewide declaration of emergency due to COVID-19 expired. Effective July 1, 2021 masking and social distancing will no longer be required of city employees or the public. However, it is recommended that individuals evaluate their own circumstance and make the best decisions for their health and well-being.

Temporary Halt in Residential Evictions to Prevent the Further Spread of COVID-19 CDC Director Dr. Rochelle Walensky has signed an extension to the eviction moratorium further preventing the eviction of tenants who are unable to make rental payments. The moratorium that was scheduled to expire on June 30, 2021 is now extended through July 31, 2021 and this is intended to be the final extension of the moratorium.

It's that time of year again! Hurricane season has officially begun and extends through November 30. It is essential that everyone have an emergency plan and supplies in place in preparation for any storm threat.
