If the vehicle is ten (10) feet in height or less, then the screening shall be at least six (6) feet in height; whereas, if any portion of the vehicle is more than ten (10) feet in height but less than fourteen (14) feet in height, then the screening shall be eight (8) feet in height. Any vehicle which exceeds fourteen (14) feet in height at any point (excluding antennas) must apply for and receive a screening permit issued by the Plan Adjustment Committee. Commercial vehicles (as defined in Section 25-43(c) of the City Code), buses, and industrial/construction/farm equipment or machinery may not be parked in residential areas.
